Queen's 90th Celebrations

It is anticipated that they will pick up the last of the stones on the new football pitch, and perhaps undertake other tasks such as cleaning up the wooden benches at Pond Corner , surveying and recording the number of trees that are dead or dying on the Amenity land and doing some work for the Church.

School Road traffic

P.C.S.O. Hayley Greenhill attended our last Council meeting and has promised to get further monitoring of School Road with the possibility of occasional patrolling. We are awaiting more details, but it was also pointed out to her that in reality the speeding on Church Street is just as bad !

Your Council has also looked into a scheme used in some other villages of having speed signs on wheelie bins which will act as a reminder to drivers about the speed limit when they are put out.

These signs cost £2.50 each. If ANY residents, whether on School Road or not, would like any signs please let the Clerk or any Councillor know. At the moment it is not anticipated that the Council can afford to pay for them so residents are likely to be required to pay for any signs that they request.

COMMUNITY CAR SCHEME

As only one person indicated that they might make use of a Community Car it was decided not create a formal body but we have arranged for that one person to be given informal help when she requires it.
